Public safety update: Light the way for kids; set a good example

Many of you have commented on the signs posted this weekend reminding members to "Walk Facing Traffic" and "Carry a Flashlight After Dark." Several thanked me for the timely reminders; several remarked that common sense wasn't so common anymore and one person was even very concerned, thinking that someone had been hit on the road, prompting the signs. No one has been hit yet

and we want to keep it that way. Safety starts with the adults in our community. Please lead by example - walk facing traffic and teach your children to do the same. Our roads are narrow, winding and busy so stay alert at all times and step onto the shoulder when a car approaches. You can't get out of the way of oncoming traffic if you can't see it.

Our roads are also dark, with few streetlights. Ideally those out after dark should wear something reflective but, at the very least, you should carry a flashlight. No flashlight at the cottage? Download a flashlight app to your smartphone. No smartphone? Go to the Dollar General in Colchester and pick up a flashlight and batteries. Stay safe.

Monday garbage pickup continues until Sept. 8

All-Waste Control will collect trash and recyclables twice a week (Monday and Friday) through Sept. 8. The Town of East Haddam has implemented "single stream recycling" so it is no longer necessary to separate the various recyclables into separate containers and/or put them out on separate days. All recyclables can be combined and placed into a single container and put out with your regular trash. We must recycle:

1. Glass and metal food and beverage containers (rinsed); lids go in trash

(No broken glass, mugs, windowpanes, ceramics, light bulbs, mirrors, dishes or tempered glass)

2. Plastic containers Nos. 1 through 7 (rinsed); lids go in trash
3. Newspaper, magazines, cereal/pasta boxes, milk and juice cartons, junk mail (No phone books, wax- or plastic-coated cardboard, soiled newspaper or magazines, books, plastic (Tyvek) envelopes)

4. Cardboard (broken down) (No wax coated boxes, soiled boxes, pizza boxes)

Please place your trash in a covered container if it will be outside at night.

POALH LEGAL NOTICE PAYMENT OF PROPERTY TAXES

All persons liable to pay real estate taxes to the Property Owners' Association of Lake Hayward as levied on the October 1, 2014 Grand List are hereby notified that the taxes are due and payable on July 1, 2015 at the mill rate of 3.50. The taxes will become delinquent on August 3, 2015 if not paid by this date. Delinquent tax bills shall be subject to interest of 1.5 percent per month reverting to the due date, July 1, 2015. The minimum interest charge is \$2. All persons in the Tax District who do not receive a tax bill should call the Tax Collector at 860-295-8769 to obtain their bill before the end of the grace period, August 3, 2015. Failure to receive a property tax bill does not invalidate the payment of the tax or related delinquent interest charge if not paid by August 3, 2015. Tax payments shall be made by mail to Tax Collector, Property Owners' Association of Lake Hayward, Post Office Box 230, Colchester, CT 06415.

The 2015 Pavilion Registration Form, available on our website, states in part:

- No fires of any type
- No use of grills within 20 feet of the pavilion
- Cars parking in a beach parking lot must display a current POALH parking pass. No additional parking passes will be issued for guests attending private parties. Additional parking at the ball field is available for your guests.
- No taping, nailing or thumbtacking of decorations or signs to any wall, door or pillars

- No fires of any type
- No use of grills within 20 feet of the pavilion
- Cars parking in a beach parking lot must display a current POALH parking pass. No additional parking passes will be issued for guests attending private parties. Additional parking at the ball field is available for your guests.

7. No glass on any beach or in the pavilion.
8. All trash and cigarette butts must be removed from the beach and beach area and disposed of properly.
9. Use of the beach and beach area is limited to Association members and their guests.
10. Cars parking in a beach parking area must display a current POALH parking permit.
11. Beaches and Association properties are closed from Midnight to 6 a.m. Police take notice.
