We had a great turnout last Sunday at the Firehouse for our June Meeting with over 120 attendees. Some post-meeting comments: because of time and the packed agenda, I felt that the discussion on our bid process for vendor services needed some clarification and closure. Someone asked about our best practices in our request for proposal (RFP) and bidding process. In previous board meetings, we had discussed and established our guidelines in contracting services. We have not deterred from this practice but have been open to review bids from both invited providers as well as unsolicited bidders who are trying to get our business.

At the end of the day, POALH is not required to accept the lowest bid as it is not always the best bid. A number of criteria are considered in the process, whether we are contracting with a new or evaluating an existing vendor—circumstances change. We have made the commitment to engage contractors who demonstrate licensure to operate, appropriate levels of insurance, necessary equipment to perform the work and the staffing to complete the project on time. All committees are required to obtain three bids for all work over \$3,000. The requirement for three bids may be waived depending on the circumstances, especially in the case of an emergency or a problem that affects public safety. It is our practice to review all the criteria for our returning vendors each contract period. While cost and performance are factors in the evaluation process, the winning bidder for the mowing contract this year met all of our requirements.

As an additional follow-up to the meeting, we have posted the Special Needs form from the Town of East Haddam Emergency Management Department on the website. Information on the Police Tip Hotline and other safety and security tips will be posted in the near future.

I would also like to remind everyone that Lake Shore Road is a public town road and is being monitored by the police. We had a resident ticketed early this week and fined \$120 for driving over the yellow line. Please check your speed and drive on your side of the road while watching out for bikers and pedestrians. Pedestrians should not walk down the middle of the road. I am told you will also be ticketed.



We had a successful launch of our first community message on the Global Connect Service. If you did not receive your reminder of the Lake Weed Treatment Event on Wednesday, then we do not have a contact phone number for you. Please be patient as we are experiencing some customer-service issues with the provider in the set-up of our database. More info to come on how you can let us know which numbers to use for notification.

MUSIC AT THE MEETINGHOUSE

Check out the **Summer Concert Series** at First Church of Christ Congregational in East Haddam. Take advantage of the special three-for-the-price-of-two rate: \$30 for all three concerts by calling 860-537-2052 before July 19th.

The Summer Concert Series for 2013 begins on **Saturday, July 20, at 7:30 pm** with a stellar performance by the **Thimble Island Sax Quartet**. Led by musician and composer Frank Vasi, this group of artists represent in average over 30 years of experience each: David Langlais plays soprano, Richard Barnes is on alto, Frank Vasi handles the tenor (and has done all the arrangements), and Tim Moran covers the baritone. BEACH RULES - (PLEASE INFORM GUESTS AND RENTERS OF THESE RULES)

1. Parents or chaperones are responsible for their child's safety and their child's actions at all times.
2. Children cannot be left at the beach unattended.
3. Infants must be in leak-proof ("swimmie") diapers at all times.
4. Fishing within 100 feet of the swimming area is strictly prohibited.
5. Use of boats and watercraft within the swimming area or within 100 feet of rafts is prohibited.
6. When passing a beach area, dogs must be on a leash. Dogs are never allowed on the beach.
7. There is no swimming after 11pm.
8. All trash and cigarette butts must be removed from the beach and be properly disposed of. Glass containers are prohibited on Association property.
9. Use of the beach area is limited to Association members and their guests.
10. Cars parking in a beach parking area must display a POALH parking sticker or a guest pass.
