Wow – can you believe it is the end of July already. Well time flies when you are having a great time!

Well it is time to start talking about Lake Hayward Days festivities. We will be introducing some new items this year and will tell you all about them in this and future newsletters as well as functions that need volunteers.

As we all know, the great success of LH Days is directly proportional to the number of volunteers who sign up. If you're a veteran I am hopeful that you will step up to the plate once again this year. If you have not had the opportunity to participate in the past there is no better time than this year to get involved. It's fun, it's rewarding, and it is a fabulous way to meet people.

In this letter I will outline a unique service that will be provided by Dick Bailey and his colleagues at his Masons' Lodge. The project was discussed at the June meeting and had a lot of support. We spend so much time talking about the joy and pleasure that we get from being at the lake that sometimes we forget about the dark side of our society. By the dark side I am referring to Amber Alerts, child abductions, and child kidnappings. Unfortunately one does not need to think too far back to recall when child abductions had national media attention.

While it is my sincere hope that none of you will ever have to experience the worse day of your life, the Masons sponsor a great project called the Connecticut Child Identification Program to assist both you and law enforcement officials should a child be missing. With this program the Masons will collect the following information on your child: a color photograph, a dental impression, a DNA sample, a set of fingerprints, a saliva sample to assist tracking dogs, and a VHS taped interview to record the child's speech pattern, mannerisms, and important characteristics.

This service will be provided at no cost to you and your child. Mason volunteers perform all the work and it is part of their commitment to public service. The Masons **keep none of the data and information**; it is all given to the parents to maintain in a safe place (and bring on vacation) and hopefully you will never need to use it.

The plan is for the Masons to be at the lake on Saturday August 27th, which is also the carnival day of Lake Hayward Days. They will set up their operation in the tennis court and will be available from noon until 4 PM.

Again it is unfortunate that parents need to be concerned about child abductions, but what better tool to have available should such a crisis occur. Everyone is encouraged to take advantage of this valuable community service and special thanks goes out to Dick Bailey for recommending and volunteering himself and the members of his Freemasons' Lodge.



**F. Y. I. Allegra Farm and Carriage Museum Linda Ryder-Munet 537.2052**

John Allegra owns the Allegra Farm and Carriage Museum. He started the business in 1973 with farms in Milford, East Hampton, and most recently on Route 82, close to the Gillette Castle road. John (who has a degree in architecture) designed and built the Victorian barn after being inspired by trips to Newport, R.I., Shelburne, VT, the Stonybrook Carriage Museum on LI, and the Royal Mews in London. The barn was built with the help of many friends and neighbors and was used for wedding receptions, barn dances, and special events as well as to house the horses, ponies, hay and equipment. It also had a special wing for the carriage and sleigh collection. After this barn was sold, Allegra bought the current property at the top of the Lake Hayward basin.

Allegra's horses and carriages are well known throughout southern New England, and continue to be used for special events and romantic occasions. Carriage rides are popular year round, but especially hay rides in the fall and sleigh rides in the winter (when there's enough snow). The farm has at least six pairs of horses, and these teams can be found at Gillette Castle, Mystic Seaport and throughout Connecticut and nearby states. These horses are movie and TV stars as well as they were seen in Armistad, Kate and Leopold, The Time Machine, Sex and the City, Ed, and Johnny Zero.

Allegra employs drivers and farmhands to keep the carriages rolling, but some people volunteer their time, just wanting to be part of the endeavor. Allegra continues to run the farm with the assistance of his son, also named John, who has done all the renovation and land work himself.
