Similarly Steve Perrone has offered to teach the course sanctioned by the Coast Guard and awarding graduates with certificate to apply for the CT Safe Boating License. To put this in perspective, anyone operating an electric motorized vessel on Lake Hayward is required to obtain a safe boating license. For sailboats a license is required if the boat is 19.5 feet or longer but strongly encouraged for all sail boaters regardless of sailboat size. Firework Safety

With the 4th falling on Wednesday this year it has been hard to predict just when folks will be setting off fire works around the lake. If you still have some yet to set off, please do so safely.

The biggest problem with fireworks is that when things go wrong, they go wrong **very** fast. Whether it is a serious injury or a significant fire, I have unfortunately seen them all.

Fireworks Facts:

- Key Point: Five out of six (84%) of Emergency Room fireworks related injuries involved fireworks that Federal regulations permit consumers to use.
- **The highest injury rate occurs in the age group 5-9 years old**
- Annually over 9,000 fireworks related injuries are treated at hospital emergency rooms. Note: this number does not include patients treated in doctor's offices or walk-in clinics.
- Seven people are fatality injured by fireworks yearly.
- The temperature of a burning sparkler varies from 1200 – 1800 degrees based on the material used. **Please do not throw them in the lake.**
