Message from the President ~ Tim Pelton

A brief word about our beach rules. The folks that serve on your Board are there to govern and direct your Association. They are not the Beach Police. If you observe someone violating the rules below, you should *politely* remind them that there are beach rules and the rules are in place to enhance everyone's enjoyment at the beach. It's real simple. If everyone does their part and 'plays by the rules', the beach is the greatest place to go to for relaxation and having fun.

The top ten beach rules are:

10. Cars parking in a beach parking area must display a POALH parking sticker or a dated guest pass.

9. Use of the beach area is limited to Association members and their guests.

8. All trash and cigarette butts must be removed from the beach and be properly disposed of.

7. There is no swimming after 11 PM.

6. When passing a beach area, dogs must be on a leash. Dogs are never allowed on the beach.

5. Use of boats and watercraft within the swimming area or within 100ft. of rafts is prohibited.

4. Fishing within 100 feet of the swimming area is strictly prohibited.

3. Infants must be in leak-proof diapers at all times.

2. Children cannot be left at the beach unattended.

And the Number One POALH beach rule is:

1. Parents or chaperones are responsible for their child's safety and their child's actions at all times.


